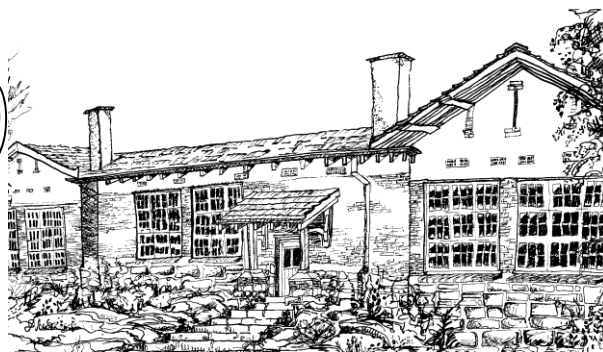

From the Principal

Questions

Please email me any quick queries or questions and I will respond as soon as I can. Recent questions below.

Q: Why is the athletics carnival being held at the Gil Fraser Reserve and not on the school oval this year?

A: Our school oval is very small, especially since the Arts block was built and we struggle to run 75m races. The fence and trees can be a hindrance. In recent years we have trialled holding the carnival at Fremantle Oval and Perry Lakes as well as on our oval. Gil Fraser is another idea. We will review again next year.

Q: Why don't you teach Sex Ed?

A: It's not in the K-6 curriculum. The year 5-6 curriculum does cover puberty.

Q: I was wondering if there was going to be a school fete this year?

A: The last fete was 16 November 2013 and they are traditionally every four years, so it's due next year. The P&C is discussing whether to have one next year or whether to do something different.

Q: Which secondary school do Richmond students go to?

A: Our feeder high school is John Curtin. Students go to lots of schools though. Last year's destinations are typical - below.

Q: Do students or classes follow a theme for the book week parade?

A: No. Just dress as any book character.

Q: What does ECE mean?

A: Early childhood education. That usually means K-1.

Q: I've heard about the whooping cough going around. What's the school policy on immunisation?

A: Parents have to provide an immunisation record on enrolment, or a statement declaring they do not plan to immunise their child. The large majority of children here are immunised, but not all of them.

Q: What is the dress up parade? Is Kindy involved?

A: The dress up parade is for Book Week. It will be during assembly this Friday 26 August. The parade itself will be the last item in assembly - about 9.25am in the undercover area on the main site. All students dress up as a book character for the parade and the Student Council gives out prizes for the best costumes. Kindy to year 6 are all involved.

Q: Will there be a sausage sizzle or canteen orders at the athletics carnival?

A: No. All students need to bring a packed lunch. There will be a cake stall.

Q: I heard that there will be a pre-primary class in the off-site ECE centre next year?

A: Yes there will. We are under significant enrolment pressure. We sometimes have PP in our offsite centre when there are too few classrooms on the main site to house all classes.

Q: Can you get a cyber-safety expert to speak to students please?

A: I plan to get Paul Litherland in when he is free. He is fantastic. He speaks to students but is also great for parent information, which is crucial for understanding and regulating your child's interactions on the internet. Most issues occur at home due to unsupervised access. I have heard Paul speak twice and highly recommend him. The P&C is going to book him for a parent information session.

Q: What is the school doing to monitor children on social media sites?

A: Primary school aged children are not legally allowed on social media sites. They do not have access to them at school. Usually issues occur when children have home access. Internet safety is part of the health curriculum and all children are taught how to behave on the internet. I would strongly advise that parents do not allow their under-13 children access to these sites:
