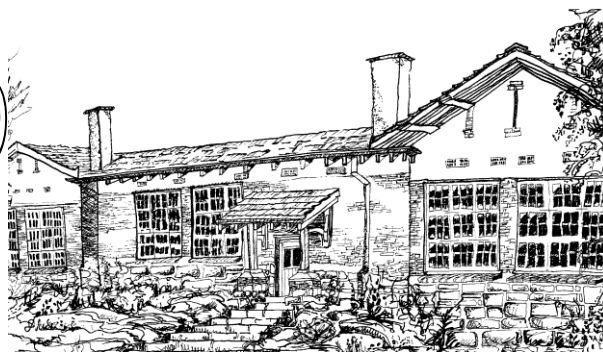

From the Principal

In term swimming has started this week. Thanks for everyone's support. All lost property will be in the office.

Questions

Please email me any quick queries or questions and I will respond as soon as I can. Recent questions below.

Q: Uniforms for pre-primary – when / how do I get details about what uniform I need to purchase for Pre-primary next year?

A: PP uniform is the same as the main site – there is a picture of all items in our main office. Go to Willetton uniforms, Unit 2, rear 185 High St, Willetton tel: 94577 333. Or website: www.willettonuniforms.com.au

Q: How are staff appointed?

A: I have to check that the DoE has no redeployee staff to place. If they don't, I merit select staff. I currently have adverts running for a cleaner, special needs education assistants, and manager corporate services and pools in operation for teaching positions. I have over 2500 teachers in the Richmond pool wanting a job here.

Q: What are the main things principals do, I have no real idea?

A: Richmond is a big business with 43 staff, 430 students on site and 700 parents. I manage the business.

This involves *financial management* – I have \$3,500 000 annually to run the school, pay everyone and buy everything we need; *human resource management* including selection, training and monitoring of staff, curriculum leadership and the enrolment, management and pastoral care of students; *physical resource management* – maintaining an old building is not simple or cheap, as well as ensuring we have enough furniture, resources etc; *policy and planning* – ensuring we are compliant with an awful lot of DoE policies and procedures and reporting to the DoE for accountability on everything from the room 4 canary to the canteen food policy to the chaplaincy to our use of ICT to our implementation of the curriculum to our number of critical incidents...as well as planning for the future;

community relations – daily liaison with parent groups – P&C and Council and well as lots of individual enquiries.

Plus anything else that comes up daily when 430 children are running around – and a lot does!

Q: How is the student council elected?

A: Year 5s nominate, make a speech and year 4 and 5 students and staff vote.

Q: When can I collect my Campion order from school?

A: Friday December 2 between 8.30-10.30am in the Art room.

Q: Can I use the SMS system to advise of upcoming absences?

A: Yes, use for all absences – past, present and future. State the exact dates and child's full name please.

Q: How do children get into the talent quest?

A: Posters are up around the school for students to sign up. Auditions are now and the top acts will be invited to perform in the quest.
