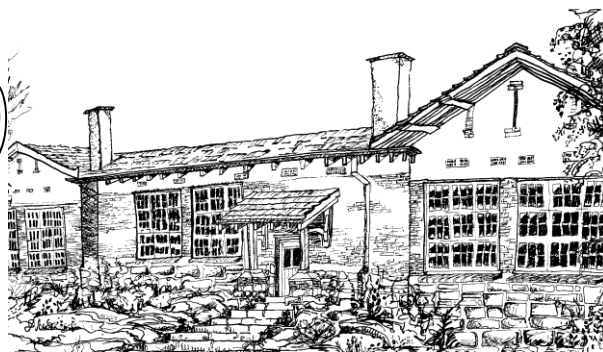

From the Principal

Thanks to everyone for indicating whether they will be taking their child to the athletics carnival on Wednesday or whether they will be travelling on the bus with us. Five buses have been booked. They are full, so there is no more capacity to put your child on the bus.

If you are taking your child to the carnival. Please hand them over to their class teacher and collect them from the class teacher at the end of the day for duty of care.

If your child is absent on the day of the carnival please SMS us as early as possible so that we have time to reconfigure races / buses.

All children need to bring packed recess, lunch and a water bottle, hat and fleece. They will be offsite all day. There will be a cake / ice cream stall if they have a small amount of money.

The toilets are in the North Fremantle Football Club Hall. We have the hall to ourselves but it is important not to send children on their own. Please do not use the public toilets behind the old grandstand near the main gate.

St Johns will be present with a medical tent. We have paid for this to deal with any medical issues on the day. Feel free to approach them. All our medical supplies including all personal epipens will be in their tent.

Every student has opted to travel on the bus **or** with parents. This is BOTH ways. If they come on the bus they must leave on the bus. If parents bring them, parents must collect them. No half and half please. With over 350 children aged 5-12 it is logistically very difficult to start swapping arrangements. I have to be accountable for where every child is. Please don't simply take them from the oval without signing them out, or change your mind about the bus. Thank you for your support on this. We are looking forward to fine weather and a lovely day.

Q: How are numbers looking for 2018 kindy?

In brief:

- Gifted and Talented Programs are available at a number of public secondary schools.
- Selection is based on the results of the Academic Selective Entrance Test coordinated by the Department of Education for all Gifted and Talented program applicants. The test includes individual assessments in the areas of mathematics and science, language, writing and non-verbal reasoning.
- Applications for entry to any gifted and talent program in 2019 open in October 2017 at a date to be advised and **will close February 2018**. Once applications open, a parent must lodge their child's application online.
- Perth Modern: parent information session for 2019 intake will be in term 4 this year. Dates will be on this website soon.
- Anyone can register interest online to receive notification of the opening of applications.
- You do not have to live in the school intake zone to be accepted to a program.
